What is the Anglia Ruskin Scholarship scheme?

In line with its commitment to encourage progression and to reward success, Anglia Ruskin provides a **non-repayable, non means-tested** Scholarship to full-time UK/EU undergraduate students on HEFCE or TDA funded courses who pay the full fee of **£3,375** (2011/12).

The Scholarship payments are intended to help towards the costs of studying, such as books, equipment, travel, study aids, childcare and other course-related costs.

How much is it worth?

The Scholarship is worth £500 for each year of study, payable in two instalments of £250 each year, directly into your bank account.



Am I eligible?

You are potentially eligible for the Scholarship if you are a registered full-time student studying at a Partner College and you meet the following eligibility criteria:

- you are an undergraduate home/EU student paying the full fee of £3,375 in 2011/12
- you are on a HEFCE or TDA funded course
- you are studying one of the following awards
 - BA (Hons) or BSc (Hons)
 - Foundation Degree
 - Dip HE
 - HND
 - Cert HE
 - PGCE
 - Graduate Diploma/University Diploma worth at least 120 credits.

If you meet the above criteria, you must then be in attendance and progressing successfully each year in order to receive the awards.

Students who have all or part of their fees paid by the NHS are **not** eligible for this Scholarship award.

If you are assessed as an ELQ student (e.g. you are studying on a course that has an Equivalent or Lower Qualification aim than the highest qualification you have achieved previously) unfortunately you will also not be eligible for the Scholarship.



If I am eligible how and when will the funds be awarded?

You do not need to apply for the Anglia Ruskin Scholarship as we will automatically contact you, via your student email account, at the start of your second semester if you potentially meet the eligibility criteria. You will be asked at this point to log into e:Vision and complete a 'Confirmation of Eligibility' task.

The first payment of £250 will be made subject to attendance and completion of the 'Confirmation of Eligibility' task. The second payment (£250) based on academic progression will be made upon successfully completing all required credit for the academic year.

Funds are awarded directly into your bank account via the BACS system.

September/October starters

You will be asked to complete a 'Confirmation of Eligibility' task in your e:Vision account at the start of your second semester with us to confirm your eligibility. The first payment will be made at the end of February 2012.

Your second payment will be automatically paid at the end of August 2012 if you successfully achieve the required credit.

February starters

You will be asked to complete a 'Confirmation of Eligibility' task in your e:Vision account during June 2012 to confirm your eligibility. Your first payment will be made at the end of August 2012.

Your second payment will be automatically paid at the end of March 2013 if you successfully achieve the required credit for the year.



What do you mean by academic progression?

At the end of each academic year we will check the level of credits that you have achieved. If you have attained enough credits*, you will receive your second Scholarship payment of the year. Credits that have been compensated count as being 'passed' and will be included in your credit total.

* Please note the credits attained must be Anglia Ruskin credits. Credits obtained elsewhere cannot count towards an Anglia Ruskin Scholarship.

If I have outstanding failure from one year, does that mean that I cannot get any Scholarships for the next year?

No. Each year is treated separately. Even if you do not get your payment for academic progression in one year, you will still get your 'in attendance' payment the next year, as long as you complete the task in e:Vision. If you pass all credits required, you will also get that year's 'academic progression' payment. We will check at each assessment point to see whether you have redeemed the previous year's failed credit.





How will you know my bank account/building society details?

You should go to your e:Vision account <https://e-vision.anglia.ac.uk> to enter your bank account details and to confirm that they have been entered correctly. Our system will know when you have done this, ensuring that payments can be made in February and August.

It is very important that you check and confirm your bank account details in e:Vision, which you can do at any time. It is your responsibility to ensure that the data we hold is correct and up-to-date.

What happens if I owe the University money?

Any outstanding debts you owe us may be deducted from any Scholarship payments due to you.
